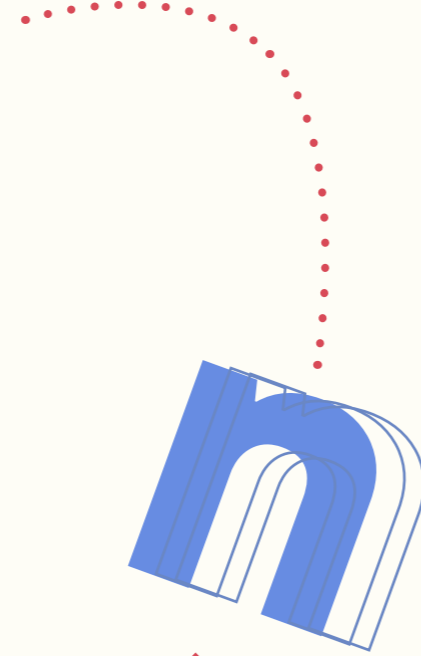

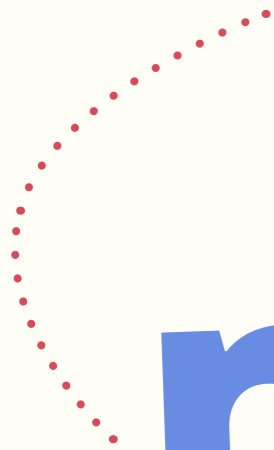

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INTRODUCTION TO TOOLKIT



BACKGROUND

We have entered into the world of digitalisation, where digital tools are increasingly being used for remote work and collaboration. When there are times where we won't be able to meet physically, working online can be a great way as well.

Based on the survey conducted based on the focus group results, students have highlighted that they feel a sense of disconnection and lack of authentic connection experienced by an individual in their interactions with others. They express frustration with the tendency of people to seek information without engaging in meaningful communication or reciprocating when approached for help. This leads to a perception of being used and a feeling of being the only one making an effort in maintaining relationships. The underlying sentiment is a desire for genuine connections and a genuine exchange of information rather than superficial interactions.

WHO SHOULD USE THIS TOOLKIT?

We created this toolkit for students who want to find out how to be able to find other students for collaboration or/and how to collaborate effectively.

The aim of the collaboration is that UAL students will be able to equip hard skills such as having quality portfolio, learning new skills set from their team mates. CREATIVE COLLABORATION



What is creative collaboration?

Creative collaboration is a “A partnership between two or more persons with a common objective of generating new items through specific ideas and shared understanding of something new and a common goal” is the definition of creative collaboration. Fundamentally, this means that a team is cooperating to find a novel solution to a problem or to develop an entirely new idea.” Rodhouse (2021)

Collaboration is necessary in the industry because it helps to advance the project to greater heights because of the different ideas being bounced off each other. Sometimes, collaboration work doesn't need to be bounded in physical setting such as school or office. It can be done through virtually at the comfort of your own home.

According to a stanford study, it has been said Individuals who work in collaborative settings at work are more than 50% more effective at completing tasks than those who work independently. (Boskamp)

How does it work in digital spaces?

A collaborative space is a localized space with open access to resources that promotes openness and collaboration regarding knowledge sharing, skills and tools.

There are many different types of collaborative spaces, including coworking spaces. Co-located environments are ideal for collaborative creative work.

Creative Collaboration via digital space can come in various formats, ranging from online presentation to collaborating with others via different modes such as taking videos.



IMPORTANCE OF CREATIVE COLLABORATION

Studies have indicated that promoting collaboration could result in higher academic accomplishment for university students since it offers learning chances outside of the classroom and teaches important social skills like effective communication, creating trust, and reciprocity (Gumienny et al.)

Here are 3 essentials to why collaboration is important:

The more brains come together, the better it is

You may pool your thoughts and approach problems from several angles when you work with others.

By combining a range of abilities and knowledge to take on more complicated and large-scale problems, you can undertake projects in a group setting that you couldn't complete alone.

When more people gather together, it helps individuals to approach problems from different perspectives when you work with others. Also, combining research discoveries with the many viewpoints of a varied team is essential for successfully fostering innovation



Allow for skills and perspective exchange

Individuals from various backgrounds or disciplines have vastly varied perspectives on the same item. We can gain new insight into a topic by considering and learning from the thoughts and viewpoints of others when we approach it from a different perspective.

Less conflict and prejudice will also result from the capacity to understand others' viewpoints. Hence, working together with people from different backgrounds, whether they be professors or students, will result in fresh perspectives and inventive solutions to problems.

Allows students to build networks and friendships

Recent research on friendship and teamwork found that friendship significantly increased team performance. The skills and traits of teammates who become friends are truly valued by each other.

Therefore, these colleagues can coordinate tasks more effectively because they know each other's strengths and weaknesses. Ohio State University's Fisher College of Business doctoral student Seunghoo Chung led the study.



FINDING STUDENTS FOR COLLABORATION

There isn't a particular way where you have to follow in order to find people to collaborate.

Here are some ways you can find other people to collaborate with.

01

Join societies at school

Joining a sports club or any societies in your school is the best way to meet new people. You will meet people from different courses and school around UAL. Take this opportunity to talk to different people and network with them through events.

When you become a member of a club, you already have something in common with the other members. This makes it simpler to create pals and locate new acquaintances.

Approach your lecturers

Using online platforms

PRACTICAL TIPS ON EFFECTIVE COLLABORATION

Peer Learning

Peer learning promotes stronger social skills, cooperation, patience, and teamwork. Each student's talents can complement the group and advance learning in a cooperative peer learning setting.

Be open to feedback

Respect everyone's time and commitments

HOW CAN STUDENTS COLLABORATE WITH OTHERS

There are many ways through which students can collaborate with one another. It doesn't necessarily have to be a class assignment in order to collaborate. It can be seen as through problem based learning, peer teaching, case studies and many more. Here is an example of practical way whereby students can be collaborate with one another.

Advertising example:

In advertising, there are alot of oppotunities to collaborate with one another such as through group projects or competition like AD&D awards.

1 Ideation

In the creative process known as “ideation,” team members produce ideas throughout sessions (e.g., brainstorming, worst possible idea). Team members get together with open minds to generate as many ideas as they can to address a problem statement.

2 Project Planning

During this stage, there is a few items would that the the team would need to discuss as a team.

- **Defined roles and responsibilities** - Specifying roles and responsibilities for each team member keeps everyone accountable and on track to finish their part of the project on time.
- **Resource allocation** - Teams allocate resources, and time to complete the project in the most efficient way possible.
- **Communication plan** - Outlines how team members will communicate with each other throughout the project. It will also outline who reports to whom, when these reports are due, and where project information and knowledge is stored.

Peer Feedback

Feedback from peers enables students to better understand their work and that of their peers. This leads them to find ways in utilizing their peers’ skills and become productive as a team. Peer feedback allows them to effectively communicate their ideas and suggestions.

CONCLUSION



Even though there can be many ways to help students for collaboration, there is still a gap where UAL can assist students, in particular freshmans, or international students to source other students for collaboration. 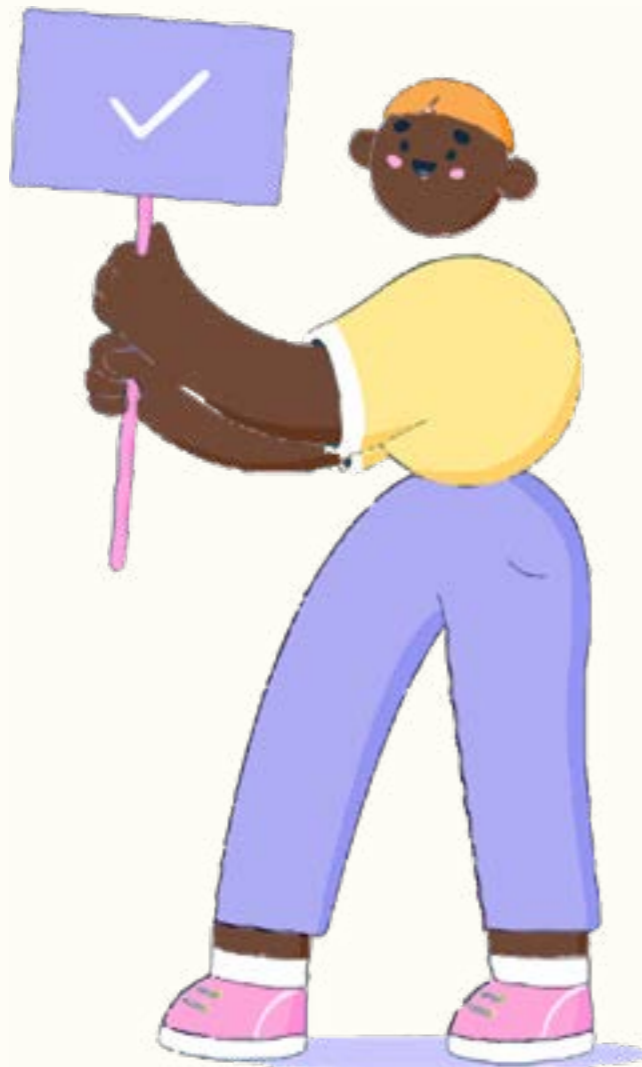
